

# Burmese Starred Tortoise



**Habitat:** dry zones of forests and grassland in Southeast Asia

**Size:** 9-12 inches

**Diet:** Grass, mushrooms, fruit but have been known to eat insects and larvae.

**Reproduction:** 1-6 eggs incubate for 90-120 days
